

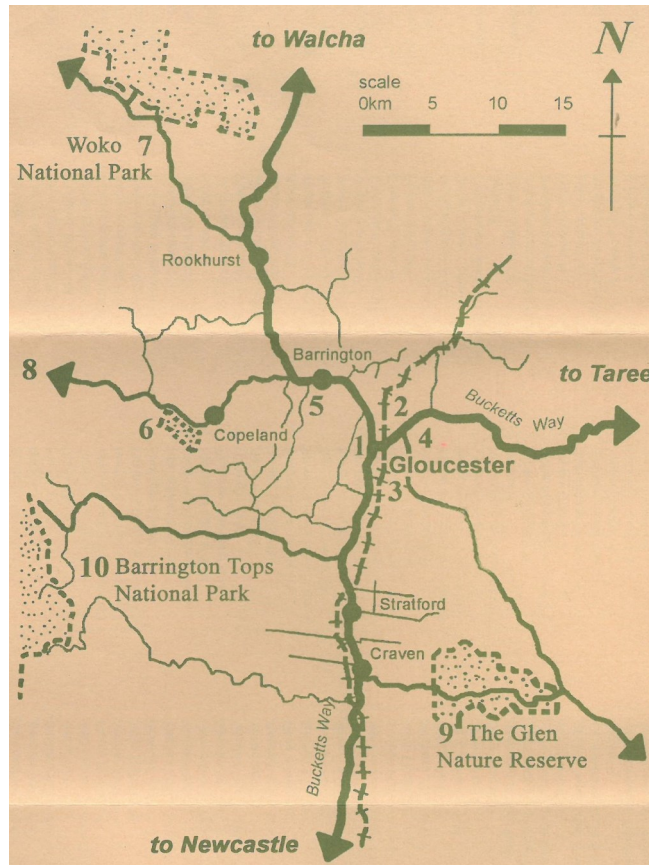

In the Barrington Tops Gloucester Region

The Gloucester and Barrington Tops are the perfect destination for Birders, Bird Watchers & Twitchers. The region draws migratory birds from the mid-eastern seaboard and warmer north-eastern region of NSW, as well as having a significant population of resident birds.

The natural unspoilt landscape of grassland valleys, rivers, wooded ranges, National Parks, State forests and State Conservation areas provide a rich habitat for our feathered friends.
